Krill

From the Norwegian krill, small fry of fish. Krill may be small, but are one of the most abundant animal species on the planet. Most of the larger Antarctic animals, whales, seals and seabirds as well as fish and squid depend directly or indirectly on krill. Krill mainly eat phytoplankton (microscopic plant life) and some zooplankton (microscopic animal life).

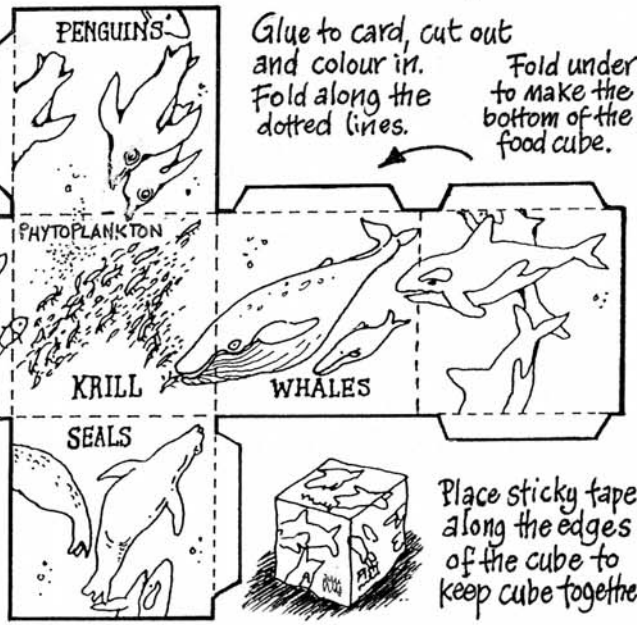

Food Cube

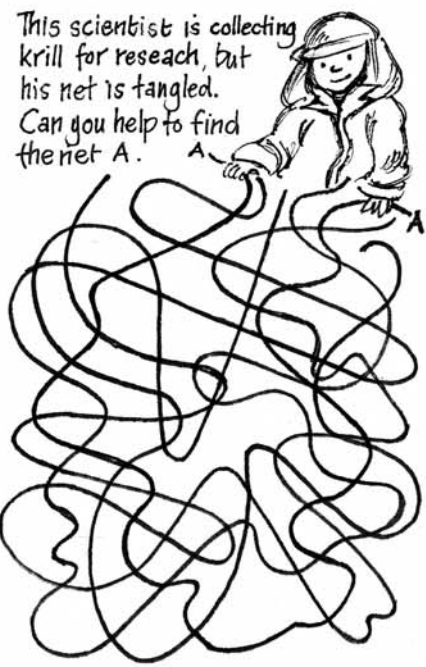
Follow these simple instructions to make your own Antarctic food cube.



Glue to card, cut out and colour in. Fold along the dotted lines. Fold under to make the bottom of the food cube.

Fold flaps down and inwards

Place sticky tape along the edges of the cube to keep cube together.
